



Understanding of the World

We will be using 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' as an opportunity to look at making our own porridge. We will learn that many of the foods that we eat are plants that we cultivate including the oats in the porridge that we eat. We will explore how the oats change when we add milk and heat. We will look at different fruits that we can add to porridge to make it super tasty.



Learning through Story
