Understanding of the World

We will be using 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' as a springboard to look at wild animals, a variety of bears in particular. Children are naturally fascinated by animals and many favourite children's books and songs are centred around animals. We have many toy animals in the nursery. We will explore different kinds of bears panda, brown bears, Koala etc. We will talk to the children about animals that people look after, (domestic) and animals that can look after themselves (wild.) We will learn the names of wild animals such as bear, fox, wolf, otter, badger, squirrel, animals that live in British or Northern European woods and learn about their habitats. We will look at 'information books' with children and learn interesting facts about animals.

The development of children's artistic and cultural awareness supports their imagination and creativity. At Kintore, we ensure that children have time to explore and play with wide range of media and materials. The quality and variety of what children see, hear and participate in is crucial for developing their understanding, self-expression, vocabulary and ability to communicate through the arts.

During this block of learning children will be supported to act out the storyline of the wonderful 'We are Going on A Bear Hunt'. They will be encouraged to use the rich language from the book as they play out the narrative with teachers and friends. On the art table, children will have the opportunities to create the images of the landscape that the story characters travel through, the wavy grass, the squelchy mud, the whirling storm, the dark cave using a variety of materials including paint, chalk, and clay. They will also be able use and also create puppets to support their exploration of the story.

As they sing 'The Teddy Bear's Picnic, they will feel and express the atmosphere created by the melody and rhythm. Children's vocabulary develops very naturally as children learn new words in the context of story. A variety of activities will be explored in the context of this song. This will include preparing for a 'Teddy Bear's picnic by making sandwiches etc and by creating disguises and acting out the narrative.
