Black History Month

During October, we are taking part in national celebrations to honour the accomplishments of Black Britons across society and across history. We are inviting parents to be part of these celebrations by coming into Nursery to share a part of their family history and culture with the children. This could be:

- Talking to the children about your family history/home-country (show photos or special objects)
- Painting pictures with your child inspired by artists such as Frank Bowling and Jennifer Packer.
- Reading a story that celebrates Black culture with the children.
- Showing the children clothes what you wear on special occasions.
- Showing the children how you style your child's hair what products and accessories you use.
- Playing dominoes with the children or other traditional family games.
- Teaching the children traditional songs.
- Cooking dishes such as Jollof rice, plantain and dumplings.

Let your child's Key Person know which activity you would like to take part in.

Core Books, Songs and Poems

The children love to share books and stories and bring them to life with props and by acting them out. We share 2 core books this half-term in both the Under 3's classes and the 3-5's classes. Core books are books which we think that the children will enjoy and that we would like them to know well. Children are retelling these stories as part of their role-play whilst playing together and with small world toys. The repeated retelling of these stories extends language, vocabulary and the learning of key concepts. Children also sing core songs and rhymes which supports language development.

You need to apply online at www.southwark.gov.uk/schoolsadmission

Please try and find 6 <u>schools</u> for your application. Look at schools' websites and contact the schools' offices to find out about open days and visits.


Lots of schools will hold open days from October.
