Constructing Houses

Children will investigate which materials are best for building houses using straw, paper, sticks and blocks. *How about building a house using junk modelling materials at home?*



- How will we join the boxes together to make our house strong?
- How many people can fit in it?
- What about the roof?
- Is our house waterproof?
- Which is the smallest house?

Learning through Poems and Story

Children's communication skills will be extended when playing with their stick puppet characters they've made from 'The Three Little Pigs'. They will read and re-tell the story using key vocabulary such as 'straw', 'brick' 'chimney', 'first', 'second', 'third' and use repeated phrases such as "I'll huff and I'll puff and I'll blow your house down."

Home Learning- No cook Playdough



Ingredients

- 2 cups for plain flour
- 1 cup of salt
- 1 table spoon of vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon of cream of tartar (optional)
- 1 cup of cold water
- A few drops of food colouring (optional)

Recipe

Mix all the dry ingredients together.

The food colouring should be mixed in with the water. Then add the water to the dry ingredients.

Adjust the consistency by adding more flour if it is too wet or a little more water if it is too dry and crumbly.

Knead the dough to make your playdough.
